**** All** MAT Secondary Education (9-12) students **must** enroll in EDUC 692 Advanced Professional Seminar (3 sch) and EDUC 697 Advanced Clinical Experience (6 sch) to complete the MAT Secondary Education (9-12) Program.
All MAT students, including Residency Licensure teachers, must complete and submit a Clinical Experience (Student Teaching) application to the HPSE department chair's office. The application for Clinical Experience (Student Teaching) must be submitted the semester before the clinical experience (EDUC 692 & EDUC 697) is anticipated. Candidates who are not currently employed as a Residency Licensure teacher must be placed in a public-school classroom by the College of Education's Office of Teacher Education.

Note: To be eligible to apply for your license in your content area you must take and successfully pass the PRAXIS II exam (passing scores below) and edTPA (passing score is 38).
