Reported Crime: Fondling

Location: Fayetteville State University Campus

Notice is being provided to the campus community. The above listed crime was reported to and is being investigated by Fayetteville State University Police Department.

We are sending this message for you:

- To protect yourself and others in our community.
- To notify you that there may be or have been a threat to the campus community.
- To help us with the investigation of a possible crime.

Please be advised that FSU Police Department received a report on the date and time noted above that a fondling of an FSU student by an unknown suspect occurred in a residential hall on FSU’s campus. During the incident, an unknown female suspect approached a female student and touched her buttocks.

The suspect is described as a black female approximately 18–20 years of age, with a bun type hair style, wearing a pair of blue and white pants, a t-shirt, and no shoes. The suspect was last seen exiting the residence hall.
