#### **Eligibility Requirements:**

- Must be a U.S. Citizen
  - Complete degree prior to 42 years of age.
  - Must be physically and mentally qualified for commission as a Navy Officer.
  - Must be enrolled in, or accepted for transfer into a nursing program accredited by either the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), or the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).
  - Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above to apply.
  - Degree requirements must be fulfilled within 24 months.
- #### **Service Obligation:**
- Total Service: 8 years.
- 4 year active and 4 years in the reserves.
